

Active Learning General Strategies



- Provide a safe environment for students to engage in your class.
- Build in active learning activities every 20 minutes or less that engage the students in the content.
- Give instructions to the activity and what you want them to produce.
- Have materials prepared ahead of class
- Use a variety of strategies
- Decide when and where you want to implement active learning strategies. Face to face, Zoom or Online (Asynchronous)

What is Active Learning?

At Saint Leo, we believe that our students should be actively involved in the learning process. Regardless of whether your students are sharing a table on campus, connecting remotely from their family room, or working at 3:00 AM from some faraway location, they should be engaged in meaningful activities that help them not only master the content, but also gain awareness about their own learning processes. Rather than being passive participants in their courses, our students write about their ideas, work collaboratively to solve problems, and curate resources that bridge their experiences with their education. All of these are examples of active learning.

Some of us may think of engagement as listening to lectures, watching videos, or completing assessments, but there's much more to active learning. In each of those examples, we see faculty-centered environments. If we say our students are listening, what is it you picture? Most likely, you're imagining a professor lecturing and students observing from their desks. If we say watching, perhaps the image that comes to your

- Be a good human.






Building Classroom Community






On Ground Strategies



- Learn students' names (use tent cards, take pictures of groups, study the roster)
- Include time to "get acquainted"
- Arrive early and chat (each week)
- Establish an environment of safety based on mutual trust.
 Varying viewpoints are welcome in the context of respect.

Provide asynchronous opportunities for students to interact and collaborate

Virtual (Zoom) Strategies



- Have students upload a photo or image that represents them (in Zoom profile).
- Encourage them to use Zoom backgrounds; offer an extra credit point for the student who has the best background representing the reading/content for that week. Use a student poll to decide.
- Have someone monitor the chat (chat ninja)
- Ask for feedback like you really care



Virtual (Zoom) Strategies cont.



- Arrive early as you would to an on-ground class. Greet students as they arrive; show kindness, empathy, care, concern (host at a party).
- Use Zoom annotation tools to create opportunities for students to interact, respond, have a voice.
- Use Zoom breakout rooms; assign introductions at first group meeting; give specific tasks; use collaborative document/template for task; keep groups stable for 3-4 weeks.
