

KEY ASSIGNMENT FAQs

WHAT ARE KEY ASSIGNMENTS?

Key assignments are designated course assignments that have been selected by programs and/or faculty course designers to assess student learning outcomes. Key Assignments must be assessed using the rubrics attached to the assignment folder in D2L.

HOW DO I KNOW IF MY COURSE CONTAINS A KEY ASSIGNMENT?

WHAT IS AEFIS AND WHY ARE WE USING IT?

AEFIS (Assessment, Evaluation, Feedback, & Intervention System) is an Assessment Management System that facilitates the collection and reporting of learning outcome data from course Key Assignments. Faculty can utilize the data for continuous programmatic improvement, which is required by SACSCOC and other accreditation bodies. AEFIS seamlessly connects to your D2L course, so you will never be required to grade key assignments outside of your course shell.

WHO MUST COMPLETE THE KEY ASSIGNMENT TRAINING?

WHERE DO MY STUDENTS SUBMIT KEY ASSIGNMENTS?

Students will submit all Key Assignments to an assignment folder in D2L.

WILL MY STUDENTS RECEIVE TRAINING?

Students will not need training to submit Key Assignments. All Key Assignments are submitted to assignment folders in D2L, which is a process already familiar to students.
